Collector Is Jailed On Perjury Rap

New York-A 47-year-old witness before a grand jury investigating the activities of Cosa Nostra leader John (Sonny) Franzese was sentenced yesterday to a 21/2-to-5year prison term for perjury.

Manhattan Supreme Court Judge Abraham J. Gellinoff imposed the sentence on Hyman Nadelson and ordered him to city jail, denving a request for bail pending an appeal of the case. Nadelson had been found guilty of the perjury charge last Dec. 6.

Assistant District Attorney Michael Metzger said that Nadelson, whose address was given as 1245 E. 18th St., Brooklyn, was called before the grand jury late last year to answer questions concerning efforts to collect bets from Arthur Sonneschein, who is under indictment and awaiting trial with Franzese on 42 counts of bookmaking and conspiracy. The grand jury heard testimony that Nadelson was hired by John Popkin, owner of the Hickory House Restaurant on West 52d Street, to collect money from Sonnenschein. The prosecution alleged that Sonnenschein came under the protective arm of Franzese and that all collection efforts suddenly came to a halt.

Nadelson was granted immunity from charges of attempted extortion when he appeared before the grand jury, but still contradicted the previous testimony and claimed that he knew nothing of the matter. That denial led to the perjury charge. Metzger said that Nadelson's reluctance to testify because of "the underworld code of Omerta (silence), made it difficult to prosecute Franzese."

Sonnenschein is accused of operating four bookmaking offices in Manhattan, doing a total business of \$100,000 a week. One of the offices was said to be in the back room of a button factory on 34th Street, another in a midtown fur shop, and the others in private apartments on 44th Street and 84th Street.

DAs to Seek Easing of Cop Search Law

New York-Broader police power to stop and search automobiles for narcotics will be one of the major requests the State District Attorneys' Association will be making to the 1968 State Legislature.

Nassau District Attorney Cahn said that the proposal was one of three legislative programs to come out of a private, day-long meeting yesterday of the group's legislative and executive committees which opened a three-day conference. At present a policeman must have "probable cause," that is, he must have some evidence that narcotics are there, before he can stop and search a car for narcotics. If a judge later rules that there was no probable cause the search would be illegal and any evidence found as a result of it could not be submitted.

The other two proposals call for broadening of a policeman's right to use deadly physical force and giving police further protection from assault during an arrest, by making it unlawful to resist arrest "regardless of the propriety of the arrest."
