FBI Grabs Hood Goods

Buffalo (UPI)—FBI spokesmen revealed yesterday that a raid of reputed Cosa Nostra leader Stefano Magaddino's home in the Niagara Falls suburb of Lewiston yielded a revolver, ammunition, a gun permit and papers.

Magaddino's home and the homes of alleged associates were searched Friday prior to his arraignment on federal gambling conspiracy charges. He and eight others were free on a total of \$332,500 bail.

Federal agents listed tax returns, two foreign letters, telephone numbers, bank statements, a tape recording and other papers. The FBI said raids on the associates' homes and cars uncovered papers, cash, dice, playing cards, betting slips and other material.

Besides Magaddino's home and a car owned by the Magaddino memorial chapel, agents searched the home of Benjamin Nicoletti Sr., 56, of Lewiston, a car owned by Pasquale Passero, 44, of Niagara Falls, the home of Louis Cubello of Niagara Falls and a Niagara Falls home rented to Ronald Appoloney.

Sonny Trial Adjourned

Mineola—The trial of John (Sonny) Franzese, Cosa Nostra underboss, on charges of conspiracy in connection with a 1966 Oceanside robbery, was adjourned to Dec. 18 because his lawyer is busy on another case. It had been scheduled to start today in County Court.

County Court Judge Paul Kelly ordered the adjournment yesterday after conferring with Franzese's lawyer, Maurice Edelbaum, who said that he was involved in another case in Manhattan, which was to continue through this week. On Monday, when Franzese's trial on charges of conspiracy in connection with the 1966 robbery of \$3,000 from an Oceanside home was to begin, Edelbaum failed to appear. Kelly threatened to revoke Franzese's bail of \$100,000 if proceedings failed to get under way today. At that time, an associate of Edelbaum attributed the lawyer's absence to illness and said that Kelly was not notified because of an oversight.

Auto Victim Is Identified

East Hills—A pedestrian who was killed in an accident that occurred shortly before midnight Monday on Glen Cove Road near Talley Road South was identified by Nassau police yesterday as Michael J. Ryan, 34, of 5 10th St., Bayville.

Police said that a car driven by Judith Ledzian, 19, of 11 Locust St., Glen Cove, and owned by her companion, Lawrence Breitfeld, 22, of 30 Jefferson St., New Hyde Park, was northbound on Glen Cove Road when, according to Miss Ledzian, Ryan suddenly appeared. Police said she told them she had no time to stop.
