Iowa 28, Tennessee 22

ATLANTA (AP) — Chuck Long, the Iowa quarterback, riddled the Tennessee secondary with touchdown passes of 57, 18 and 8 yards in the second period, but the Hawkeyes had to hold off a second-half rally by the Vols in the 15th annual Peach Bowl.

Long, who connected on his first 11 passes, hit Dave Moritz on a 57-yard touchdown pass early in the second period, then found Ronnie Harmon on scoring strikes of 18 and 8 yards to build the Hawkeyes' lead to 21-7 at halftime before a crowd of 50,134.

The Vols, however, scored following the second-half kickoff when Chuck Coleman ran 10 yards to cap an 80-yard, nine-play drive. Fuad Reveiz missed the extra point, the first conversion failure for the all-Southeastern Conference kicker during his two years at Tennessee.

Iowa followed with a 75-yard scoring drive and took a 28-13 lead on a 2-yard plunge by Eddie Phillips.

Tennessee scored again in the third quarter on Alan Cockrell's 19-yard pass to Willie Gault, and Reveiz added a field goal in the last quarter for the Vols.

The Vols made two runs at the Hawkeyes in the last 7 minutes, but the Iowa defense stopped Tennessee twice, once at the 8-yard line.

Iowa finished at 8-4, and the Vols at 6-5-1.
