Shane Swanson returned a punt 49 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter to snap a 3-3 tie and Nebraska went on to a 17-3 victory over previously unbeaten Oklahoma State (4-1, 0-1) in a Big Eight Conference game today. Swanson took Cary Cooper's punt near midfield, broke up the middle and ran down the sideline after eluding the last defender.

Nebraska (4-1, 1-0) insured the victory with 1 minute 49 seconds to play when Travis Turner, who came in after Craig Sundberg had a third pass intercepted, and the split end Jason Gamble combined on a 64-yard pass play to make the score 17-3.

Michigan St. 19, Michigan 7

ANN ARBOR, Mich. (UPI) - Bobby Morse returned a punt 87 yards for a touchdown and Carl Butler scored on a 1-yard run for the upset victory in the Big Ten game. The victory before a crowd of 105,612 lifted Michigan State to 2-3 over all and 1-3 in the Big Ten. Michigan fell to 3-2 and 2-1. It was Michigan's first loss to its intrastate rival since 1978, when the Spartans won by 24-15 also at Michigan Stadium.

Morse provided a 13-0 lead when he fielded a punt at his 13-yard line, eluded a defender, turned upfield on the left side and sprinted 87 yards into the end zone. It was the first punt return for a touchdown against Michigan since 1971 and the longest for Michigan State since Al Brenner ran one 95 yards in 1968.

Illinois 22, Wisconsin 6

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (UPI) - Chris White, son of the coach Mike White, made five field goals and Jack Trudeau threw for 301 yards and a touchdown for Illinois (4-2, 3-1) in the Big Ten game. Wisconsin fell to 3-2, 1-2. White made field goals of 48, 46, 40, 27, 19 yards to tie a conference single-game record held by three others.

Iowa 31, Northwestern 3

EVANSTON, Ill. (AP) - Ronnie Harmon rushed for three touchdowns and 121 yards as Iowa (3-2, 2-1) beat Northwestern (1-5, 1-3) for the 11th consecutive time in the Big Ten game. Iowa scored on its first two possessions for a 14-0 lead with 9:15 left in the first quarter.

Texas 38, Rice 13

HOUSTON (AP) - Todd Dodge passed for two touchdowns and ran for another score before suffering a knee injury as No. 1-ranked Texas (3-0) rallied from a 7-0 deficit. Dodge, who built a 28-7 lead, left the game with a hyper-extended knee.

Missouri 52, Colorado 7

COLUMBIA, Mo. (UPI) - Missouri broke a 37-year-old school record with 516 rushing yards in the Big Eight opener for both teams. Missouri (2-3, 1-0) had 639 total yards, and its 516 yards rushing broke the school record of 466 set in 1947 against Kansas State. Colorado fell to 0-5, 0-1 - its worst start since 1980 when it lost its first seven games.

Marion Adler, starting for the first time this season, rushed for 151 yards and scored two touchdowns. Adler passed for 51 yards to become Missouri's second-leading career passer. His 3,442 passing yards put him ahead of Steve Pizarkiewicz's 1974-76 total by 29 yards. Adler, with 3,947 yards total offense, now is No. 2 on the Missouri career list, ahead of the late Paul Christman, who had 3,832.

Texas Tech 30 Texas A&M 12

COLLEGE STATION, Tex. (UPI) - Aaron Keesee threw for three touchdowns and ran 23 yards for another to upset Texas A&M (3-1, 0-1) in the Southwest Conference game. Texas Tech is 2-2, 1-1.

T.C.U. 32, Arkansas 31

FAYETTEVILLE, Ark. (AP) - Anthony Gulley scrambled from the pursuit of Ravin Caldwell and passed for a 2-point conversion to James Maness with 15 seconds remaining for the upset victory in the Southwest Conference game. Texas Christian (3-1, 1-1) achieved its best start since a 5-6 season in 1972. Arkansas is 2-1-1, 0-1-0. T.C.U., down by 31-17 with 10:19 left, beat Arkansas for only the second time in 26 games and for the first time in Razorback Stadium since 1955. Greg Horne of Arkansas missed a 27-yard field-goal attempt with 3:45 remaining and the Razorbacks leading by 31-24.
