

HARMON INJURED AS IOWA TIES

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Chuck Long recovered from four interceptions by scoring on a 1-yard run with 11 minutes 54 to play to give Iowa a 10-10 tie with Wisconsin today. Iowa (6-2-1 over all, 5-1-1 in the league) retained its Big Ten Conference lead.

Iowa, however, lost the running back Ronnie Harmon, a junior from Laurelton, Queens, who had played at Bayside High School, with two broken bones - the tibia and the fibula - in his left leg. Three plays after Harmon was sidelined, Long suffered an injury to his knee, the extent of which was to be determined. Harmon was trying to become only the second player in Iowa history to rush for 1,000 yards in a season. He had 906 yards, including 64 today.

Wisconsin (5-3-1, 3-3-1) sacked Long four times in the half and limited Iowa to 45 yards and four first downs.

Ohio State 50, Indiana 7

COLUMBUS, Ohio (UPI) - Ohio State (7-2, 5-2) built a 33-0 halftime lead with tailback Keith Byars, who has an injured ankle, playing sparingly in the Big Ten game. Indiana (0-9, 0-7) is 0-28-1 with Ohio State since 1952, the longest current non-victory streak in a continuous series. Byars, the nation's leading scorer, rusher and all-purpose runner, ran 3 yards for his 19th touchdown this season. Byars, who had 64 yards on 13 carries, had been averaging more than 167 yards a game.

Purdue 31, Michigan 29

WEST LAFAYETTE, Ind. (AP) - Jim Everett passed for 290 yards and two touchdowns as Purdue, after building a 24-point halftime lead, survived a fourth-quarter rally in the Big Ten game. It was Purdue's first victory over Michigan (5-4, 4-3) in five seasons. Michigan's Chris Zurbrugg finished with 259 passing yards, 202 in

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the fourth quarter.

Illinois 48, Minnesota 3

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (UPI) - Thomas Rooks rushed for 99 yards to become the third Illinois player to rush for 1,000 yards in a season, and David Williams caught 11 passes for 142 yards for Illinois (6-4, 5-3) in the Big Ten game. Rooks needed 86 yards going into the game to join Jim Grabowski and J. C. Caroline at the 1,000-yard mark. Williams has 1,225 receiving yards this season. Illinois became the first Big Ten team ever to have both a 1,000-yard rusher and a 1,000-yard receiver in a season.

Michigan State 27 Northwestern 10

EAST LANSING, Mich. (AP) - Lorenzo White, a freshman tailback, rushed for 170 yards and the first two touchdowns of his collegiate career for Michigan State (5-4, 4-3) in the Big Ten game. John Duvic, a sophomore for Northwestern (2-8, 2-6), set a school record when he made his 16th field goal, exceeding the 15 by Bill Panisek between 1969 and 1971.

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
