Mob suspect denied bail

A judge has refused to release accused rackets boss Michael Franzese and his alleged "enforcer," Frank Castagnaro, from jail, ruling the community would not be safe if they were granted bail.

Franzese has been in the Metropolitan Correctional Center in Manhattan since December, when he and eight others were named in a lengthy racketeering indictment that charged they raked in \$5 million using fraud and threats to pull off complicated financial schemes. An April 7 trial has been set.

Brooklyn Federal Judge Eugene Nickerson found there was evidence that Franzese, 34, of Brookville, L.I., had ordered Castagnaro to arrange the 1981 beating of Thomas Trimboli, who had evicted Franzese's car dealership from a lot Trimboli owned in Hempstead, L.I.

Nickerson said that Castagnaro, 40, of Amityville, L.I., had hired William Reese to beat Trimboli.

Nickerson's decision found that only Franzese had a motive for the assault and that his attorney had represented Reese after his arrest. Franzese lied when he took the stand and testified he had not paid Reese's bail, the judge ruled.

Nickerson noted that besides auto dealerships, Franzese was connected to 20 corporations involved in businesses including movie production and gas distribution. Franzese is facing a 177-count Florida indictment for a gasoline scam.

Franzese also "corruptly controls" the Allied International Union, the nation's largest private security guard union, Nickerson found. The judge cited secret FBI tapes in which Franzese told former Allied President Anthony Tomasso, "This is my union. You do what I tell you to do."

Franzese's lawyer said he is considering an appeal.

Witch doc in Rio will treat ill hero

RIO DE JANEIRO—An Amazon witch doctor flew here from Brasilia yesterday, toting forest plants and hallucinogenic drugs and hoping to save an eminent ecologist from the poison of a fluorescent jungle frog.

Ecologist Augusto Ruschi, a national hero famous for defending hummingbird forest reserves against lumber and paper interests for more than 50 years, said he is slowly dying after handling the palm-sized dendrobata frog, whose skin exudes a poison used to tip Indian hunting arrows.

Raoni, the plate-lipped witch doctor-chief of the Txucarramae Indians, said he will treat Ruschi for three days this week.

"I will," he said, "smoke a lot and dream . . . (Ruschi) will be taken in charge by the spirits of my dreams. I will leave my body, take the atorokon root, pulp it and put it in hot water.

"Then, I will beat the scientist with the root and put drops of the liquid in his eyes."


