Tyson: Jolly Good Show

World heavyweight champion Mike Tyson sported a bowler hat, a walking cane and his WBA and WBC championship belts when he arrived in London yesterday to size up a potential opponent, Frank Bruno. Tyson is there to watch the British contender take on James (Quick) Tillis, one of three men to have gone the distance with Tyson.

Wearing his championship belts around his waist and shoulders as he stepped off the Concorde at Heathrow Airport, Tyson signed autographs and blew kisses to the fans. "This is not my first time abroad," he said, "but it's my first time in England and I want to tell you it's a real pleasure to be here."

Krickstein, Seguso Lose

Aaron Krickstein and Robert Seguso, members of the U.S. Davis Cup team that lost to Paraguay last weekend, were eliminated in first-round play of the \$315,000 PaineWebber Classic in Orlando, Fla. No. 7 Krickstein was defeated by Scott Davis, 6-3, 6-0; No. 6 Seguso fell to Eliot Teltscher, 6-1, 4-6, 6-4.

Temple's Palmer Cleared

Investigation has shown Temple running back Paul Palmer accepted no money from player's agent **Norby Walters** while he had college eligibility, athletic director Charles Theokas said. Palmer, who set 23 school rushing and scoring records in his four years at Temple and is expected to be a first-round NFL draft choice, signed a contract with **Walters** on Jan. 2, after his eligibility had expired.

Jumbo Elliott Meet Canceled

The Jumbo Elliott Invitational track and field meet, plagued by financial problems and a troublesome spot on the calendar, will not be held this year and may have been run for the last time. It was held first in 1981, a few months after the death of Elliott, Villanova's longtime coach. "In the Olympic year 1984 it was a very good meet," athletic director Ted Aceto said, "but once you get out of that Olympics time, it's hard to get television interested, or a sponsor that wants to take over the whole meet."

Columbia Takes Fencing Title

The fourth-place finish by sophomore Jon Normile of Columbia in the epee gave the Ivy League champion Lions (15-0) the team title in the NCAA Fencing Tournament at Notre Dame. Columbia finished with 86 points, Rutgers was sixth and NYU tied for eighth. It was Columbia's first NCAA title in any sport since 1971, when the fencing team last won its title.

College Sports

Jay Dipasupil went 3-for-4, scored 4 runs and had 3 RBI, Ed Quinn was 2-for-5 with a double and 3 RBI and Mike Telesca was 4-for-4 as Columbia (13-1) beat Manhattan, 12-0, in baseball... St. John's (2-2) split two games in the Citrus Tournament in Edinburg, Texas, defeating Kansas, 7-5, after losing to Miami (Ohio), 11-9. Joe Fallacaro's two-run homer gave St. John's a 6-5 lead in the fourth inning against Kansas. Robert Lambraia had a three-run homer in the first inning. Jerry Kelly's two-run triple keyed a five-run seventh that gave the Redmen a 9-6 lead, but Miami scored five in the bottom of the inning.

In lacrosse, St. John's Mike Bolger had 2 goals and 2 assists in his team's 12-7 loss to Loyola... Queens' John Lompardo had 2 goals but his team lost to Stevens Tech, 11-3... Christopher Lila of Medgar Evers was third in the 400-meter run with a time of 49.8 in the NCAA Division III Track and Field Championships at the University of Chicago.

Furthermore...

Clippers guard Marques Johnson, who has not played since suffering a neck injury in November, met with club president Alan Rothenberg and agreed to undergo surgery, possibly as early as next week... The NBA has increased from \$25 million to \$32.5 million the price for each new franchise to be awarded next month... Former St. John's guard Ron Rowan, who played for Topeka, was selected as the CBA's rookie of the year. He is now with the Portland Trail Blazers... Chris Evert **Lloyd** denied reports she has filed for divorce from British tennis player John **Lloyd**. "Yes, we are separated," she said, "yes, we are discussing divorce, but as of now nobody has filed."... A \$360,000 Skins Game among senior golfers Arnold Palmer, Gary Player, Chi Chi Rodriguez and a fourth man will be held Jan. 30-31, Super Bowl weekend, at a site to be announced.
