Athletic director Steve Sloan disclosed the developments only five days after McKey said he planned to play for the Crimson Tide next season.

Investigators looking into the finances of Dana Kirk, Memphis State's former basketball coach charged with fraud and tax violations, said he had \$550,000 in certificates of deposit, court records show. Kirk is scheduled for trial June 22.

#### Crenshaw Tied for Lead

Ben Crenshaw (65), Donnie Hammond (63), Tom Byrum (65) and Bob Lohr, who matched the course record of 62, were tied for the lead at 9-under-par 131 after two rounds of the storm-delayed Byron Nelson Golf Classic in Irving, Texas. Greg Norman, who began the day tied for the lead with Payne Stewart, was at 68 — 132 and Stewart was at 71 — 135.

Cindy Hill shot a 7-under-par 65 to take a five-stroke lead over Nancy Lopez and Patti Rizzo after the first round of the \$250,000 United Virginia Bank Golf Classic in Suffolk, Va. . . J. C. Goosie shot a course-record 8-under-par 64 to take a three-stroke lead after the first round of the \$250,000 Vantage Dominion PGA Seniors tournament in San Antonio. Bob Charles and Chi Chi Rodriguez were tied for second.

#### FIFA Bars North Korea

North Korea will be barred from the 1988 Olympic soccer tournament according to Sepp Blatter, secretary general of FIFA — soccer's ruling body. Blatter, however, said that some games could be staged in the North. North Korea was disqualified for not taking part in preliminary-round matches.

### Holyfield May Lose Title

The World Boxing Association has threatened to strip Evander Holyfield of his junior heavyweight championship if he goes through with Friday's scheduled fight against Rickey Parkey for the IBF cruiserweight title in Las Vegas. The WBA said it will take away the title of any WBA champion who fights in Nevada because that state's commission sanctions fighters and officials from South Africa.

Jeff Fenech of Australia knocked out defending champion Samart Payakarun of Thailand at 2:24 of the fourth round to win the WBC super-bantamweight title in Sydney.
