Horsemen at Canterbury Downs in Shakopee, Minn., have voted to boycott entries for Wednesday's thoroughbred races to protest a reduction in purses, but track President Brooks Fields said there were no plans to cancel the card. Fields had announced Friday that purses would be reduced to 5 percent of the betting handle, the minimum allowed under state law. The change will mean a purse reduction of about 30 percent.

North Korean Olympic officials said Saturday they welcome a fact-finding visit by the International Olympic Committee late this week in connection with their demand to cohost the 1988 Summer Olympics. The North Koreans met with IOC President Juan Antonio Samaranch before the start of the organization's 92d session in Istanbul. North Korea wants a host role larger than the four events offered by Seoul, and the communist country threatens to lead a boycott of the Games if it doesn't get more. When the session opened, Samaranch called for unity among sports bodies to protect against outside forces that "have frequently disrupted fundamental traditions" of the Games. The major item on the agenda for the session, which runs through Tuesday, is a final vote on an eligibility plan allowing pro tennis players to compete for Olympic medals in Seoul.

Antonio Krastev of Bulgaria and Yuri Zakarevitch of the Soviet Union set world records at the European weightlifting championships in Reims, France. Krastev set a record in the over-110 kilogram class with a snatch of 215.5 kilos (475 pounds), beating his own record of 215. Zakarevitch snatched 202.5 kilos (446.5 pounds) to set a record in the 110-kilo class, breaking his own record of 201.

This is the same inept crew, remember, that tarred Knight for throwing a chair a couple of years ago when hours would have been better devoted to the possibility of teams throwing games. It's a rare day now when some story doesn't break somewhere confirming the prevailing sleaze that exists in intercollegiate athletics. The latest trend is amateurs accepting \$54,000 meal money from agentsto-be. But once an Inspector Clouseau, always an Inspector Clouseau. When it's time to grab hold of a problem, NCAA types invariably suck their thumbs, 10 to each gumshoe. Progress will begin when we find somebody to fine the NCAA for incompetence.

Ueberroth, the alert and pragmatic baseball commissioner, certainly doesn't deserve to share the same dunce cap as the NCAA. But he did come up with a similar number, 10 grand, when disciplining Argyros. Here's a mogul who owns the Seattle Mariners, which is punishment enough, and wants to purchase the San Diego Padres instead. Argyros might not get his wish, but meanwhile, he was instructed to refrain from contact with any member of the San Diego organization.


