Walters probe spreading: Now former Texas athletes involved

AUSTIN, Texas — A federal grand jury investigat-ing New York sports agent Norby Wal-ters has subpoenaed scholarship information on three former University of Texas football players, according to the university's athletic director. Athletic director DeLoss Dodds said an FBI

agent handed him a subpoena last week asking for information on former Longhorn running back Edwin Simmons, wide receiver Everett Gay and tight end William Harris. The grand jury, based in Chicago, is investigating reports that Walters and his associate, Lloyd Bloom, threatened players and rival agents to keep players from deserting him. The Austin American-Statesman reported that the subpoenas involve scholarship payment records of the three former players. Dodds said the grand jury has also subpoenaed the three Longhorns and the FBI has interviewed them, although none is represented by Walters.




