Schmidt fills up on Montreal pitching

Mike Schmidt joined Ed Delahanty and Richie Ashburn as the only Phillies to reach the 2,000-hit plateau Sunday when he homered three times in Montreal against the Expos. Schmidt became the 153rd major leaguer to reach the 2,000 mark when he homered off rookie Curt Brown in the sixth inning.

"I'm in the record book," Brown said. "It's the only time I'll ever make history."

Schmidt boosted his hit total to 2,001 in the seventh inning when he homered off Randy St. Claire. The first homer was off Larry Sorensen.
