## Kareem Rises to Top With \$3-Million Salary

The Lakers' Kareem Abdul-Jabbar, who already owns a string of "mosts" in the NBA, has added another - salary. The 40-year-old center's two-year contract, which he agreed to Tuesday, will pay him more than $\$ 5$ million

The contract calls for $\$ 2$ million next season and $\$ 3$ million n 1988-89, with the second-year salary the richest ever in team sports. Jim Rice of the Red Sox reportedly makes $\$ 2.4$ million a year, Dan Quisenberry of the Royals $\$ 2.3$ million, and George Brett of the Royals $\$ 2.2$ million. Moses Malone of the Bullets reportedly earns $\$ 2.45$ million annually.

Abdul-Jabbar initially planned to quit after next season, but Lakers owner Jerry Buss approached him with an offer to play two more years. The contract was announced by Buss at a plarty for the players at his home Tuesday night.

Abdul-Jabbar, the only man ever to play in the NBA for 18 years, averaged a career-low 17.5 points a game this season. The agreement calls for him to be a coaching consultant, working with the Lakers' centers, for five years after he quits playing.

## Walton May Sit Out a Season

Bill Walton, sidelined for most of the NBA season that just ended, may miss all of next season. The Celtics' backup center reportedly faces a decision between undergoing a minor procedure to improve his right ankle and foot, which has a fractured navicular bone, or more complicated surgery. The more extensive operation would keep him out of action all of next season but might allow him to play two or three "solid seasons" after that, the Boston Herald reported. The newspaper said the Celtics would be willing to pay Walton for not playing next season, the last on his contract, and then sign him to a new deal that would require him to play to collect his salary.

## Texas Put on NCAA Probation

The NCAA placed the University of Texas football program on two years' probation for recruiting violations going back to 1980. Texas is the fourth Southwest Conference school on NCAA probation, joining Southern Methodist, Texas Christian and Texas Tech. Two other SWC members, Texas A \& M and Houston, are under investigation for possible violations.

Under the NCAA sanctions, Texas will be allowed only 20 football scholarships instead of 25 for the 1988-89 season, and only 75 prospective athletes will be allowed to make campus visits, down from 95. The school was not barred from bowl games and will be allowed to appear on television.

The NCAA cited 51 rules violations, including players selling complimentary tickets at inflated prices and accepting car loans and cash from coaches, boosters and alumni

## Pitt Suspends 2 Football Players

University of Pittsburgh running back Charles Gladman and defensive back Teryl Austin have been suspended from the team by coach Mike Gottfried following a university investigation into reports they signed with sports agents, the Pittsburgh Press reported. Austin, a senior from Sharon, Pa., has admitted to university officials that he accepted money from New York agent Norby Walters, according to the Press. Gladman, a senior from Akron, would not admit he accepted money, according to the paper, which quoted university and NCAA sources.

## City Fencing Club Wins Sabre Title

Steve Mormando, who won the individual title a day earlier, won the clinching bout as the New York Fencers Club took the team sabre competition in the national fencing champion ships in Phoebix. It is the sixth straight team sabre crown for the New York Fencers, who Tuesday took the team foil title The New York Athletic Club was the team sabre runnerup with the Great Lakes team third.
