Hawk recruit ineligible for '87-88 season

MILWAUKEE (AP) - Brian Garner, Wisconsin's high school basketball player of the year in 1986-87, will be academically ineligible at the University of Iowa next season.

Garner, a 6-foot-2 guard who led Milwaukee Washington to the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association Class A title last season, did not meet NCAA requirement under Proposition 48, The Milwaukee Journal reported Wednesday.

Garner did not score high enough on college entrance examinations to compete next season. He can play in the 1988-89 season if he successfully completes his freshman year. He can pay his own expenses this season and still have four years of eligibility remaining. If not, he'll have only three years of eligibility left.

"It's a shame this had to happen to Brian," said retired Milwaukee Washington Coach Clyde Rusk. "This will be hard for him because he's never had to sit out before.

"But Brian loves basketball and he likes Iowa. I think he will put in his year there and be ready to go the following year."

IOWA CITY (AP) — Former University of Iowa swimmer Tom Williams won his first international competition Tuesday and Hawkeye Coach Glenn Patton hailed the victory as a step toward the 1988 Olympics.

Williams, who is in training for the Olympics with the Hawkeye Swim Club, won the 50 meter freestyle in 22.90 seconds at the 14th World University Games at Zagreb, Yugoslavia.

Also picking up a gold medal was former lowa State runner Nawal El Moutawakel. El Moutawakel, a 1984 Olympic gold medalist from Morocco, won the 400-meter hurdles in 55.21.

After the race, Williams told reporters his victory was inspired. "My father had a heart transplant last week in Chicago and I dedicate this victory to him," he said.

Also a member of the winning U.S. 400-meter team, Williams was the only American swimmer to come away from the University Games with two gold medals.

"This is an important step in Tom's pursuit in making the United States' Olympic team in 1988," said Patton, who remains Williams' coach. "This is Tom's biggest win in his career."

Williams, of St. Charles, Ill., is the fastest swimmer in the history of the Big Ten Wednesday's Results conference.
