## Irish lop receiver signed by agent

ATLANTA Notre Dame wide receiver Alvin Miller, declared unable to play this year because of a knee injury, actually was ineligible because he signed with sports agent Norby Walters, a published report said. Notre Dame Athletic Director Gene Corrigan admitted Friday the injury story was a coverup, The Atlanta Journal and The Atlanta Constitution reported in a copyright story.

Miller was Parade Magazine's high school football player of the year in 1982.

Corrigan told the papers Miller admitted to Notre Dame officials that he accepted cash and signed with Walters and associate Lloyd Bloom. Under NCAA rules, this admission made him ineligible to play his senior season.

Corrigan said he did not feel it was necessary to announce last month that Miller was ineligible.
