U.S. Team Advances In Federation Cup

Chris Evert and Pam Shriver scored straight-set victories yesterday as the defending champion U.S. team defeated Japan to advance to the second round of the Federation Cup in Vancouver.

Shriver allowed Iakiko Kijimuta to recover from a 5-2 deficit and force a tiebreaker, but Shriver won it 7-0 en route to a 7-6, 6-1 victory. Evert beat Etsuko Inoue, 6-2, 6-4, and then paired with Zina Garrison to down Inoue and Kijimuta, 6-2, 7-5.

Other nations moving to the second round were Bulgaria (over Greece), Australia (over Denmark), Britain (over Chile) and Spain (over Jamaica).

Jimmy Connors defeated Kelly Jones, 6-3, 6-4, to advance to the third round of the \$293,400 D.C. National Tennis Classic. The tournament's sixth seed, Aaron Krickstein, withdrew on the eve of his first match after X-rays discovered an apparent stress fracture of his left shin bone.

Travis Jackson Dies at 84

Hall of Famer Travis Jackson, who played short-stop on John McGraw's great New York Giants teams of the 1920s and 1930s, died Monday night at his home in Waldo, Ark. He was 84.

Jackson, elected by the Veterans Committee, was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1982, along with Happy Chandler, Hank Aaron and Frank Robinson. "The longer you're out, the more time they have to forget, and I've been out a long time," Jackson said after his selection. "I was really surprised and happy. Anybody who ever played ball wants to go to the Hall of Fame. Don't let any of them ever kid you."

Jackson played for the Giants from 1922 through 1936, compiling a career batting average of .291. He hit .339 in 1930, one of six years he topped .300. He was also an excellent defensive player with a strong throwing arm.

Longhorn Back Ineligible?

University of Texas officials have decided to declare defensive back James Lott ineligible for his senior season for accepting money from New York sports agents Lloyd Bloom and Norby Walters, the Atlanta Journal reported.

The Journal said school president William H. Cunningham confirmed only that the school was investigating the matter, but the paper quoted unidentified sources at the school as saying Lott will be notified of his ineligibility when he returns from a track meet in Yugoslavia next week.

The Journal said that Lott, one of the nation's top high jumpers, also will lose his track eligibility because he took \$1,500 from the agents after his sophomore football season.

3 Area Players Selected

The International Basketball Association named three players from the metropolitan area to attend a national camp next month with a chance to make an all-star squad that will play in The Phillipines and South Korea later this year.

Selected were Trevor Green, a 6-2 guard who played at Brooklyn; Lloyd DeBerry, a 6-3 forward for New York Tech, and Alex Agudio, a 6-3 forward for Niagara who is from Huntington Station, L.I.

Navy's David Robinson scored 21 points and North Carolina's Jeff Lebo 17 to lead the U.S. Pan American basketball team to a 111-106 victory over a squad of NBA players at Indianapolis. Chuck Person of the Pacers led all players with 33 points . . . The two most recent U.S. Open golf champions, Raymond Floyd and Scott Simpson, were inducted into the All-American Collegiate Golf Foundation Hall of Fame . . . Brigham Young University will initiate a steroid testing program in which athletes who test positive will lose eligibility and forfeit grants-in-aid for a year.

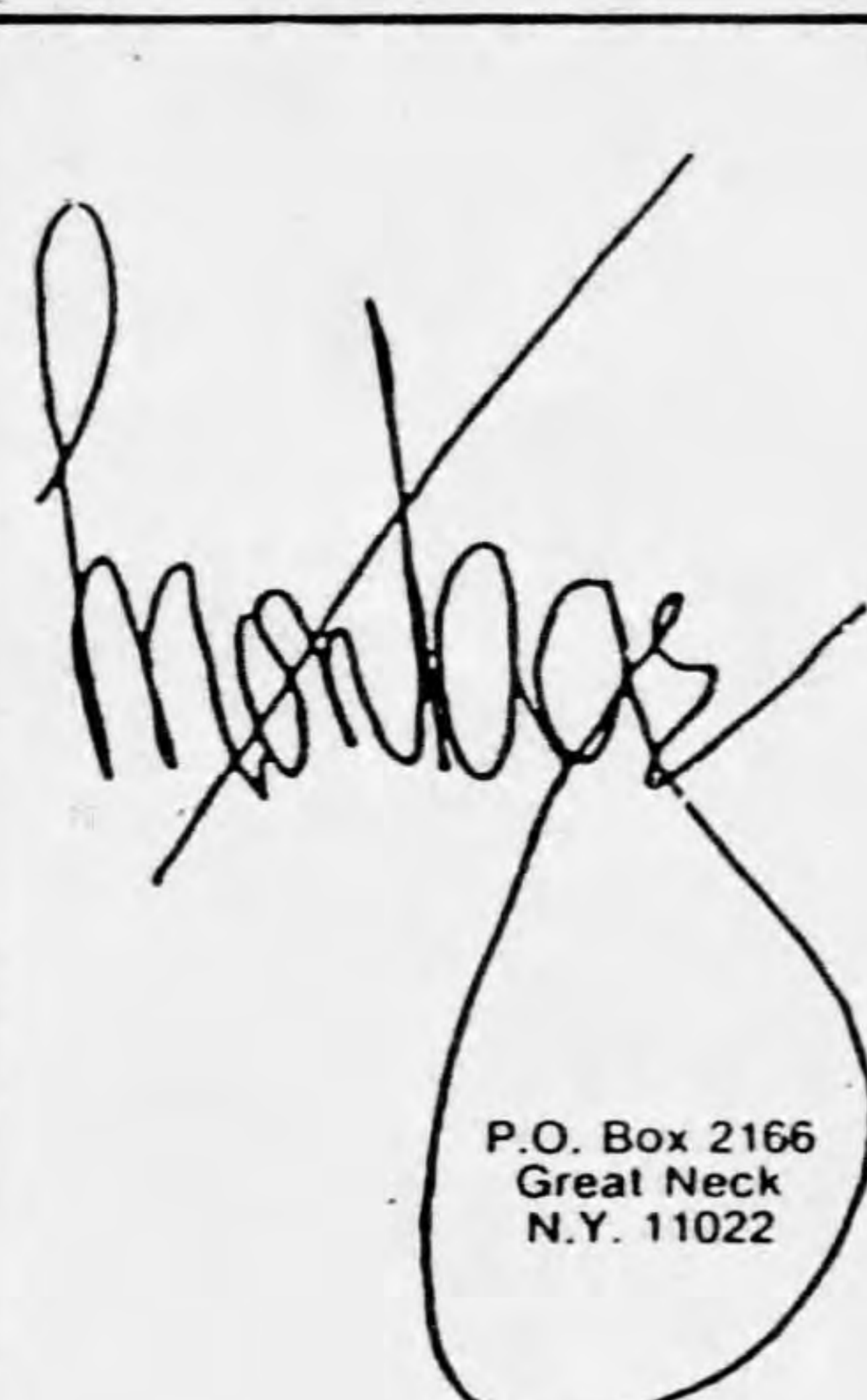
