Bears, Payton agree on new one-year pact

CHICAGO, ILL. (AP) - Embarking on his 13th season in professional football, Walter Payton has signed a new one-year contract with the Chicago Bears.

The Bears and Payton, the NFL's all-time leading rusher, had agreed to terms in December, but had to clarify details of the contract.

Although terms of the agreement announced Monday were not disclosed, published reports said it was more than Payton's base salary last season of \$687,000.

Many observers expect this season will be the 33-year-old Payton's last as a player.

Guard Tom Thayer has also signed a multiyear contract with the Bears, who are scheduled to open training camp in Platteville, Wis., on Satur-

Gayle, defensive lineman Mike Hartenstine, tight end Emery Moorehead and the Bears' top two 1987 draft picks, quarterback Jim Harbaugh and wide receiver Ron Morris.

In preparation for the start of training camp, quarterback Jim McMahon threw the football outdoors at the team's suburban Lake Forest practice field Monday for the first time since he underwent shoulder surgery Dec. 12.

Bear rookies, quarterbacks and rehabilitated players have been working out in Lake Forest since July 9, but McMahon has been working privately with rehabilitation specialist Bob Gajda.

Cade has been with the Packers since September 1985, when the team obtained him in a trade with the San Diego Chargers. The Packers gave up several draft choices, including a first-round pick, for the rights to him.

His trial in May took place the same week as the sexual assault trial of then-teammate James Lofton.

Lofton, now with the Los Angeles Raiders, was acquitted of a charge of sexually assaulting an Iron Mountain, Mich., woman in December.

About 50 spectators packed the courtroom on the third floor of the Brown County Courthouse for Cade's sentencing. Among those on hand were the victim; Cade's fiancee, Kim Wright, and teammate Ken Stills.

The victim testified during the trial that Cade forced her to have sexual intercourse with him three times during a three-hour period. The jury found Cade innocent of a third sexual assault charge.

Study warns of new perils in steroid use

CLEVELAND, OHIO (AP) - A six-month study of body builders shows that unsupervised, excessive use of anabolic steroids can lead to heart disease and a decrease in the body's ability to fight off illnesses, a research team said Tuesday.

"We as a society have a tremendous desire to gain a competitive edge, and people are willing to put themselves at tremendous risk to achieve it," said Dr. Leonard H. Calabrese, chief physician of clinical immunology at the Cleveland Clinic.

Calabrese was part of a five-member research team that studied the diet and physical well-being of 35 body builders in the first half of 1986.

Conclusions of their study are now in manuscript form, and parts of it may soon be published in various medical journals.

The subjects were volunteers, all consuming similar, high-calorie diets. Of the 35 participants, 18 were voluntarily taking high doses of anabolic steroids, a synthetic version of the male hormone testosterone. Body builders and other athletes use the steroids to gain weight and strength.

Calabrese said the drug users in the study obtained the drug on their own and were advised of the potential

"We had people who cooperated with the study. It was a situation in which as long as they were going to use steroids anyway, we wanted to be able to study the effects," he said.

Calabrese said there has been little reported in medical journals about the effect of anabolic steroids on the body's immune system.

A summary of the study said that blood tests of the steroid users revealed evidence that use of the drug 'significantly suppresses the immune response, lowering the body's ability to fight infection and, possibly, reducing its ability to provide surveillance against the development of malig-


