# Stanford Defeats NCAA in Round 1

Stanford has won a temporary restraining order against the NCAA's mandatory drug-testing program. Santa Clara County Superior Court Judge Conrad Rushing granted the order, temporarily preventing the NCAA from requiring that Stanford obtain written consents to drug testing from its athletes in order to participate in intercollegiate sports.

"I am very pleased," said Jennifer Hill, captain of Stanford's women's soccer team, who last spring joined the suit originally filed in January by diver Simone LeVant. "It means that we can play without giving up our constitutional rights."

Rushing set Sept. 29 for a preliminary hearing and asked both sides to present evidence on false "positive results" of the drug test.

## Track's Drug Testing Barred

Drug testing of jockeys, trainers, grooms and other licensees at Suffolk Downs is an unconstitutional invasion of privacy, a Suffolk County (Mass.) Superior Court judge has ruled. Judge George A. Sullivan's decision, delivered to the Massachusetts State Racing Commission, said such random and probable-cause testing is "an invasion of major proportions."

Racing commission chairman Gerald Venezia said the decision will be appealed.

## Graf, Lendl Top Seeds

Steffi Graf and Ivan Lendl are the top seeds for the U.S. Open, which begins Tuesday at the National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadow.

Defending champion Martina Navratilova, who recently lost her No. 1 ranking to Graf, is seeded second and Chris Evert, a six-time Open champion, third. It is the 16th consecutive year Evert has been seeded at the Open, a women's record. It is the first time since 1980 that someone other than she or Navratilova has been the top female seed at the Open.

Lendl, seeking his third consecutive title, is the top male seed. Stefan Edberg is seeded second, followed by Mats Wilander. The highest American seed is five-time Open champion Jimmy Connors, marking the 16th year in a row he has been seeded in the Open, one shy of the men's record held by Frank Parker. #### Maleeva Sisters Win

The Maleeva sisters, Manuela and Katerina, led the advance into the quarterfinals of the \$150,000 United Jersey Bank Classic in Mahwah, N.J. No. 3 seed Manuela Maleeva, ranked 10th in the world, won a 75-minute match with Nathalie Tauziat of France, 6-1, 6-4. Katerina Maleeva, ranked 19th worldwide, beat Jo Durie of Britain, 6-2, 6-3. Top seed Helena Sukova unleashed 10 aces in beating rookie pro Beverly Bowes, 6-1, 6-3.

### Pitt Player Reinstated

The NCAA Eligibility Committee has restored the eligibility of Pittsburgh senior defensive back Teryl Austin, who admitted taking money last year from sports agent Norby Walters in violation of NCAA rules. Austin must sit out Pitt games against Brigham Young Wednesday and North Carolina State on Sept. 12. The NCAA ruled he must repay the \$2,500 he received from Walters.

#### IAAF Approves Lifetime Ban

The International Amateur Athletic Federation unanimously passed a resolution calling for life bans on athletes who persist in using illegal drugs.

Athletes using ephedrines will be banned for a minimum of three months for a first offence, two years for a second and banned for life on the third. Offenders using other substances on the IAAF list of forbidden drugs will be banned for two years for a first offense and for life if they transgress again.

#### Furthermore...

The Flames acquired the rights to free-agent defenseman Brad McCrimmon. In return, the Flyers will receive a first-round pick in either 1988 or 1989, with Philadelphia to determine which year, and a third-round choice in the other year . . . The Capitals have signed free agent Peter Sundstrom, a former Ranger who played in Sweden last season. Suns general manager Jerry Colangelo is trying to put together a group to buy the NBA franchise.




