Ex-Agent Incriminates Nine College Athletes

A former Atlanta sports agent has produced contracts signed by eight college players, the Atlanta Constitution reported yesterday. Since signing a contract is outlawed by the NCAA, following the disclosure four of the players and Texas A & M running back Melvin Collins were declared ineligible by their schools.

Jim Abernethy, saying he decided to make his dealings public after having a religious experience, produced contracts signed by Auburn defensive back Kevin Porter, Texas A & M offensive tackle Tony Bartley, TCU's Wayne Waddy, John Booty and Tony Jeffery, Georgia Tech's Riccardo Ingram and two Memphis State basketball starters, Marvin Alexander and Sylvester Gray. He reportedly will produce a contract signed by Collins later this week.

Bartley and Collins will be held out of A & M's Cotton Bowl meeting with Notre Dame and Porter has been declared out of the Tigers' Sugar Bowl game against Syracuse. Memphis State declared Alexander, a junior, and Gray, a sophomore, ineligible pending an appeal to the NCAA.

NCAA: Coach Lied to Us

The NCAA placed Cleveland State's basketball program on three years' probation, instead of imposing a less severe penalty, after determining that coach Kevin Mackey lied four times to investigators.

David Didion, the NCAA's assistant director of enforcement, said Mackey and assistant coach Eric Shanaberger each lied four times to the NCAA and assistant athletic director Merle Levin lied once and encouraged someone else to lie.

The Vikings will be kept out of postseason tournaments this season and next season, and Mackey will not be allowed to recruit off campus for an unspecified period of time. CSU officials denied the recruiting violations that allegedly occurred during the 1983-84 season and said they will appeal.

NCAA Penalizes Alabama

Alabama must forfeit \$253,447 in basketball receipts for using two ineligible players in the 1987 NCAA Tournament, the NCAA ruled. The players were not named by the NCAA, but Alabama athletic director Steve Sloan confirmed that they were center Derrick McKey and guard Terry Coner, both of whom had dealings with New York sports agent **Norby Walters**. McKey was declared ineligible by the school, entered the NBA draft and was picked in the first round by Seattle.

Alabama reached the regional semifinals of the 1987 tournament before being beaten by Providence.

Ray Malavasi Dies at 57

Ray Malavasi, who coached the Rams to their only Super Bowl appearance, in 1980, died of a heart attack in Santa Ana, Calif. He was 57. Malavasi coached the Rams for five seasons before being fired after a 2-7 record in the strike-shortened 1982 season. John Robinson replaced him as coach.

A college lineman for Army under Red Blaik and Vince Lombardi at West Point, Malavasi was a longtime NFL assistant coach who also served as interim head coach of the AFL's Denver Broncos in 1966, going 4-8.

Schembechler Has Surgery

Michigan football coach Bo Schembechler underwent seven hours of surgery to replace four coronary arteries inserted during a heart-bypass operation 11 years ago. Doctor Otto Gago, head of the team that performed the surgery at St. Joseph Mercy Hospital in Ypsilanti, said three of the four arteries were completely blocked and the fourth was 90 percent closed.

"The prognosis is very good," Gago said. "There was no heart damage. He will be hospitalized a week, 10 days at most."

Team USA Beats Soviets

Corey Millen scored two goals and added an assist to lead the U.S. Olympic hockey team to a 9-1 victory over the Soviet Select team at St. Louis.

The Americans took the lead 34 seconds into the game on a goal by Allen Bourbeau and led 4-0 after one period in winning for the third time in four games against the touring Soviets.

Game 5 is scheduled for tomorrow in **Bloomington**, Minn.

Bruce Says No to Kansas

Fired Ohio State football coach Earle Bruce has turned down the head coaching position at the University of Kansas, the school announced. Bruce, 56, also has been in contact with Southern Methodist about its vacant head coaching job.

Meanwhile, the Massillon (Ohio) Evening Independent reported that Southern California coach Larry Smith will succeed Bruce coach at Ohio State. Smith angrily denied that the report, saying he has not even spoken with OSU officials.
