"Chris is a 22-year-old player of enormous potential," said Hawks President and General Manager Stan Kasten. "He's as gifted an athlete as one could find in a sevenfooter and he's the type of athlete that we always want for our team."

Washburn averaged 3.8 points in 35 games last season for the Warriors and spent part of the season undergoing treatment under the NBA Drug Program. He was averaging 4.1 points a game this year in eight games.

He is scheduled to join the Hawks today and be in uniform when Atlanta travels to Milwaukee Friday night.



Ex-Rams coach Malavasi dies

SANTA ANA, Calif. (AP) — Ray Malavasi, who coached the Los Angeles Rams to their only Super Bowl appearance, died Tuesday of a heart attack, a spokesman for Western Medical Center said. Malavasi was 57.

Malavasi coached the Rams for five seasons, the last in 1982. The Rams played in the Super Bowl in 1980, losing 31-19 to Pittsburgh.

He was fired after Los Angeles had a 2-7 record in the strikeshortened 1982 season and John

Robinson replaced him as coach. Malavasi suffered the heart attack while at the Federal Building in Santa Ana and was in full cardiac arrest when he was brought to the hospital, according to Western Medical Center spokesman Donald Di-

Malavasi had undergone major heart surgery in recent years, according to Jack Faulkner, the Rams' administrator of football operations.




