Ivan Lendl and Martina Navratilova today gained the semifinals of the Australian Open. Lendl crushed the last surviving American, Todd Witsken, 6-2, 6-1, 7-6 (7-4). Three-time champion Martina Navratilova struggled before ending the challenge of sixth-seeded Helena Sukova, 6-4, 7-6 (7-3).

In the semifinals, Lendl will face either Wimbledon champion Pat Cash of Australia or Michiel Schapers of The Netherlands. Navratilova will meet the winner of the match between Chris Evert and Claudia Porwick of West Germany.

Illinois' White Resigns

Illinois football coach Mike White has resigned after an investigation by the NCAA into alleged recruiting violations, a university spokesman said. One of the allegations reportedly involved payment for lodging to a prospective athlete by an assistant coach. In eight years at the school, White had a 47-41-3 record. Illinois finished 3-7-1 in 1987, the worst record for the Illini since his first season as their coach in 1980.

Bloom Said to Be Offered a Deal

Sports agent Lloyd Bloom said federal prosecutors have told him to expect to be indicted in the next few weeks, and a newspaper reported Bloom has been offered a deal in exchange for testimony against fellow agent Norby Walters. The Atlanta Constitution reported that U.S. Attorney Howard Pearl in Chicago has offered Bloom a deal carrying a 16-month prison term to testify against Walters. Bloom, of Los Angeles, and Walters, of New York, have been the focus of a 10-month federal probe of their dealings with college athletes.

IOC Courting North Korea

IOC president Juan Antonio Samaranch said he plans to ask Soviet leader Mikhail Gorbachev to convince Cuba and North Korea to attend the Seoul Summer Games. The deadline for confirming attendance at Seoul was midnight Sunday, but Samaranch said the IOC is "continuing a dialogue" with the Eastern bloc and that he expects to meet with Soviet foreign minister Eduard Shevardnadze in Madrid this week.

Baseball Collusion Hearing Begins

As the damage hearings in the 1985 collusion case got under way in Los Angeles, the baseball players' union requested that Kirk Gibson, Carlton Fisk and 12 others be allowed to become free agents immediately. Dick Moss, a prominent agent, is scheduled to testify today for the union, which is seeking tens of millions of dollars in damages resulting from the owners' conspiracy against signing free agents in 1985.

Froese Starting Again

Bob Froese, who was the Rangers' forgotten man when John Vanbiesbrouck started 11 of 12 games but who played well in appearances against the Canadiens and Flyers last weekend, will be rewarded tonight with a start as the Rangers open a seven-game road trip with a game against the Kings in Los Angeles. Ron Duguay (back strain), Marcel Dionne (sore left knee) and Mark Tinordi (stomach problems) did not accompany the club to the Coast. To shore up their forwards, the Rangers called up center Mark Janssens from Regina of the Western Hockey League for a tryout. — Helene Elliott

Stephane Richer scored a pair of third-period goals to help the Canadiens hold off Edmonton and snap the Oilers' sevengame unbeaten streak with a 6-4 victory in Montreal.
