lowa wrestling coach Dan Gable will be looking for more progress when his third-ranked Hawkeyes host No. 8 Wisconsin at Carver-Hawkeye Arena today at 2:30 p.m.

owa improved to 9-1 in duals with a 26-11 victory over No. 10 Minnesota Thursday night, but Gable wasn't pleased with coaching victory No. 200.

"It's not a step backwards," said Gable, 200-10-2 in 12 seasons at Iowa. "We'd have had to get beat for us to take a step backwards.

"But we haven't showed much progress the last week. We just didn't feel very good. We didn't look overpowering. We're going to have to keep getting better."

Gable said it may have been a little hard getting up for Minnesota after last week's dramatic 22-15 win over Iowa State, highlighted by Brooks Simpson's pin of Eric Voelker at 190 pounds.

"I noticed the guys were still watching Simpson's match through Wednesday," Gable said.

Simpson was held out of the Minnesota dual — "he's nursing a minor injury" - but is expected back day against the Badgers.

Wisconsin was expected to be Iowa's biggest challenge in the Big Ten Conference this season, but the Badgers lost to Minnesota, 21-17, at the Virginia Duals.

The Badgers finished second to Iowa in the Big Ten Championships last season and were 11th at the NCAA tourney.

Dave Lee at 167 pounds and Jeff Jordan at 150 are Wisconsin's top matmen. Lee was ranked second

behind Iowa's Royce Alger at 167, but since Alger moved up, Lee should move into the top spot. Jordan was 39-10-1 and fourth in the NCAA meet last season.

Freshmen Mike Carpenter (13-3-1) and Bart Chelesvig (15-5) will battle Jordan and Lee, respectively. Carpenter has looked steady all season while Chelesvig dropped his second straight match at Minnesota Thursday after winning his first two as a Hawkeye.

Alger at 177, Brad Penrith at 126 and heavyweight Mark Sindlinger continue to shine for the Hawkeyes. Alger is 24-1, Penrith 24-2 and Sindlinger 24-5-1.

The newest Hawk, 134-pounder Joe Melchiore, impressed Gable in his Iowa debut Thursday night. "Melchiore wrestled well, but he missed some opportunities," Gable said of the two-time all-American who left Oklahoma after his sophomore season.

Gable also was impressed with 158-pound all-American John Heffernan Thursday. Heffernan (17-6) scored the night's only fall, decking Steve Duval in the first period.

Iowa is 51-7-3 against Wisconsin and has won 88 straight duals in the Big Ten, 73 in a row under Gable.

TONIGHT, IOWA STATE hosts unranked Clarion at 7:30 at Hilton Coliseum. The Cyclones are 11-3 and are coming off their first backto-back dual losses in Coach Jim Gibbons' three seasons. ISU lost to owa (22-15) last Saturday and to Northern Iowa (19-17) Tuesday.

Defending NCAA champ and topranked Tim Krieger continues to lead ISU with a 14-0 mark at 150.

5, in college wrestling Friday. The Panthers improved to 10-2, NIU fell to 2-6-1.





'Ironhead' says he wants to skip senior year and join NFL

PITTSBURGH (AP) - Craig "Ironhead" Heyward, Pitt's All-American running back and an expected frontrunner for the 1988 Heisman Trophy, hasn't attended classes this semester and has told friends he wants to play in the NFL this fall, according to published

reports. Heyward, the second-leading runner in University of Pittsburgh history, flew to Washington, D.C., Friday night to meet with agent Bruce Allen, the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette reported in its Saturday editions.

NCAA rules prohibit a player from having any contact with an agent while he has college eligibility remaining.

The 5-foot-11 Heyward, who weighed 284 pounds for Pitt's 31-28 loss to Texas in the Bluebonnet Bowl last Dec. 31, apparently would not be eligible for the NFL draft in now an Allen client, and Teryl April because he has one year of Austin disclosed last summer they eligibility remaining and has not graduated. However, if the NCAA declares

Heyward ineligible, he could be

placed in a special supplemental

draft, as Pitt running back Charles

Gladman and Ohio State wide receiver Cris Carter were. Carter lost his college eligibility for accepting money from an agent,

while Gladman refused to cooperate with a school investigation into agents' dealings with Pitt players. Former Pitt players Tony Woods, accepted money from agent Nor

Walters while still in college. Austin

later returned the money and regained his eligibility. Several NFL scouts said Heyward, a redshirt junior and the

nation's second-leading rusher last season with 1,655 yards, would be a high first-round draft pick if he were eligible for the April draft.

The Post-Gazette reported Heyward has told friends for several weeks he wants to turn pro. The newspaper said Heyward did poorly in his fall semester classes and has not picked up his books for winter terms classes, which began Jan. 6. Heyward, who rushed for more

than 100 yards in all 12 of Pitt's games last season, finished fifth in the Heisman Trophy balloting behind four seniors.
