

Horse owner files suit over race run in '87

TULSA, OKLA. (AP) - An Oklahoma horse owner filed a \$4.6 million federal lawsuit Wednesday claiming fraud in the 1987 All American Futurity because the winning horse in the \$2 million race in New Mexico was

The New Mexico Racing Commission ruled in January 1988 that Elans Special, the first filly to win the race in 10 years, was drugged twice before the All American Futurity, considered the Kentucky Derby of quarter

horse racing. Doyle Rice, owner of second-place finisher Elaina Rae, asks in the lawsuit filed in U.S. District Court in Tulsa that Elans Special be disqualified as the winner and his horse receive the title.

Rice, who asked for a jury trial in the case, also is seeking \$656,500 in actual damages and \$4 million in punitive damages based on his allegations of fraud.

Rice, of Pryor, Okla., names as defendants in the suit the owner of Elans Special, Dr. Lindsay Burbank of Leesburg, Fla., and the horse's trainer, John Buchanan, of Fort Worth, Texas.

Burbank, contacted by telephone at his Florida residence, said he was surprised to hear the suit had been

"I simply can say nothing at all," said Burbank, adding that this is the first such action against him in the 20 years he has been in the horse racing business. "I just hope that this will be over with soon. I was just thinking the other day that that surely was a thing of the past now."

The \$2 million annual race, billed as the world's richest quarter horse event, is run on Labor Day at Ruidoso Downs in south central New Mexico.

The commission said in January 1988 the horse tested positive for the stimulant Oxymorphone once before the August 26, 1987, trials and again before the Sept. 7, 1987, race. Elans Special won the trial race and the 440-yard Futurity.

Oxymorphone is a drug manufactured for medical use in humans, but acts as a stimulant when administered to horses.
