The biggest surprise came in the men's 200-meter dash when Regis sped to victory in 20.54 seconds, erasing the meet record of 20.73 set by Kirk Baptiste two years ago. Brazil's Robson da Silva, the world record-holder for 300 meters, finished second, but was disqualified for running out of his lane That moved third-place finisher Ade Mafe of Britain to second and Little, a junior at Drake, from fourth to third. Kingdom won the 60-meter hurdles in 7.43. That smashed the record of 7.46 set by Greg Foster two years ago. Cooman, the world record-holder and five-time European champion in the women's 60-meter dash, won her second world indoor title, leading all the way and clocking 7.05. Gwen Torrence was second in 7.07.

U.S. District Judge George Maro-

vich has refused to dismiss charges against agents Norby Walters and Lloyd Bloom, who are accused of using cash and threats of violence to recruit college athletes as clients. The trial is expected to begin late Monday after jury selection

Texas A&M paid former athletic director and football coach Jackie Sherrill \$684,000 to buy out his contract when he resigned under fire in December, school officials say. The school also released Sherrill from the final lien on his house. The value of the lien was \$90,000, the Bryan-College Station Eagle reported.

Miami Dolphins wide receiver Mark Duper was arrested early Friday driving his sports car 101 miles an hour in a 55 m.p.h. zone, according to authorities in Echo, La. Duper was released on bond from the Avoyelles Parish jail. Sgt. Ronald Lewis said Duper was booked for speeding and reckless driving. . . . ble defenses, mobile offenses and smart quarterbacks who knew how to get out of trouble and find an open receiver.

Jimmy Johnson, the new coach, likes good quarterbacks, too, and has had some in five years as head coach at the University of Miami. He has also had several players who have been arrested for rape and assault and investigated for drug and steroid use. Over 29 years, some of Landry's Cowboys got into trouble, too. But the ratio was far lower, and though a coach is not responsible for the personal behavior of his players, neither is he without influence. Just for good measure, the new coach is reputed to be fond of those exuberant, meaning loud, inspirational

speeches to motivate his players. After Landry's terseness, this is like replacing a scholarly minister with an evangelical preacher.

Too much should not be read into Landry's dismissal. Six weeks after the San Francisco 49ers won the Super Bowl on pinpoint passing is no time to say that finesse has gone out of the game, nor do football coaches lose their jobs because of sociological trends. Landry lost his because Johnson's old buddy bought the team and because the Cowboys have been losing. They may have been losing because, at 64, the coach had lost touch with his players, or because his kind of football can no longer

Which would be too bad. Like its coach, that kind of football was interesting and honorable, even if not always ingratiating.


