



Santa Anita BERDAY IS Davis' New Home



Having come to terms with his unwilling role in the tragic death of fellow rider Mike Venezia Oct. 13 at Belmont Park and his own fragile mortality in a dangerous profession, Robbie Davis resumed his career yesterday at Santa Anita in Southern California.

"I did a lot of skiing for three or four months. I did a lot of snowmobiling. I feel like a new man," the 27year Davis said by phone from the jockeys' room before going to the paddock to meet his first mount in more than four months. Hickory Crest, the horse Davis rode for trainer Bobby Frankel in the fifth race at Santa Anita yesterday was the first he has ridden in competition since Drums In The Night, the horse whose hoof struck the fallen Venezia's head, killing him instantly. Although he was helpless to avoid the accident, Davis remained for a time in isolation at his Great Neck, L.I., home after the accident, then traveled west with his family in a newly purchased mobile home. "I was able to spend time with my family," he said. "I was able to spend Christmas with my family [in Kansas] City, Kan.] for the first time in eight years . . . The accident is history. I'm still Robbie Davis. I was a good rider in New York; I'll be a super rider here." Davis said it was difficult to deal with the possibility that he could have been killed just as suddenly as Venezia, particularly since the accident occurred a little more than two months after the birth of his second child, Robbie Jr. "I grew up without a father," Davis said. "It was hard to think what it would be like for my son not to have a father." After jogging quarter horses for an old family friend in an indoor arena near Pocatello, Idaho, Davis and his family set out last week for Santa Anita in the same motor home in which they left New York. Davis booked his first California mounts himself, but yesterday hired Jeff Franklin as his agent. Franklin, until recently, represented Gary Stevens. Davis is named on two horses today and another tomorrow. After that, Franklin said, his new rider will be busy. Davis' mount got into a bit a trouble, and the slightly rusty jockey lost his whip, but finished fourth aboard Hickory Crest. He returned for the sixth race and finished third aboard Swifterthanthewind. "I rode the first race so badly, I felt like a bug boy [apprentice]," he said. "But the reception was great." As of yesterday, Davis is a California-based rider. There are no plans to return to New York. "I didn't have the confidence to come here when I was [an apprentice]," he said. "I wanted to make a name for myself. Now I'm here for the duration."

Did Harmon 195/75R14 OR 175/70R13 E Have Grades?

Chicago — Former University of Iowa running back Ronnie Harmon played football his senior year despite being on academic probation, the athletic department's academic counseling supervisor, Willie Fred Mims, testified in U.S. District Court yesterday.

Harmon and Mims were the first two witnesses called to testify against sports agents Norby Walters, 58, and Lloyd Bloom, 29, on trial for multiple charges of racketeering, extortion, mail fraud and obstruction of justice. Prosecutors have charged that Walters and Bloom defrauded seven universities of scholarship money by illegally signing athletes to representation contracts, in violation of NCAA eligibility rules.

Defense lawyers have been trying to portray Walters and Bloom as the victims of money-hungry college athletes who used the agents to set up deals with NFL teams, and then fired them to escape paying them commissions. They also want to show that although the agents may have signed and paid athletes in violation of NCAA rules - not a violation of criminal law - universities and players
