

Agassi Slammed With Record Fine

Andre Agassi's tempestuous relationship with the tennis establishment cost him a record \$25,000 fine yesterday, but he escaped suspension from this year's major tournaments.

Agassi was fined the maximum for pulling out of the inaugural Grand Slam Cup in December, a controversial \$6-million tournament boycotted by some other top players.

"It's the largest major-offense code-of-conduct penalty ever imposed," Grand Slam Committee administrator Bill Babcock said.

Santiago Cleared

The district attorney's office, citing insufficient evidence, declined to prosecute Padres catcher Benito Santiago on misdemeanor allegations of resisting arrest and driving under the influence of alcohol. Coronado, Calif., police arrested the All-Star catcher last month after an altercation with officers who had pulled over his sister.

Ex-Padre Wiggins Dead

Alan Wiggins, the catalyst of the Padres' National League champion team in 1984 whose big-league career was cut short by drug problems, died in a Los Angeles hospital Sunday. He was 32. Wiggins' mother-in-law, Anna Wood, said he died of respiratory failure from lung cancer.

The Pirates expect to make a long-term contract offer to All-Star outfielder Bobby Bonilla in two to three weeks, but don't plan to negotiate multiyear deals with outfielder Barry Bonds or pitcher Doug Drabek, club president Carl Barger said. . . . Free-agent second baseman Marty Barrett, formerly with the Red Sox, agreed to a minor-league deal with the Padres.

Tough Road for Rose

Pete Rose says life in a Cincinnati halfway house will be more difficult than his time in prison. "I think it was easier for me to do the five months in Marion [Ill.] than it probably will be to do the three months here because of my family," Rose said.

Rose, baseball's all-time hits leader, was released Monday after serving a prison term for tax charges. He still must serve three months in a halfway house and 1,000 hours of community service as part of his sentence.

Westhead Blamed for Death

Bruce Fagel, the attorney for the family of Hank Gathers, charged that if it were not for former Loyola Marymount coach Paul Westhead, "Hank Gathers would be alive today." Fagel said it was Westhead who asked Gathers' cardiologist to reduce his medicine, which, Fagel contends, led to Gathers' death.

Former welterweight champion Mark Breland will fight Feb. 4 in Albany. Breland's opponent has not been announced. . . . Canadian sprinter Ben Johnson and world record-holders Said Aouita of Morocco and Javier Sotomayor of Cuba will head a group of 23 foreign athletes in the Mobil indoor track and field circuit, which includes the Millrose Games Feb. 1 at Madison Square Garden and the Meadowlands Invitational Feb. 8 at Meadowlands Arena. . . . The United States got its second gold medal of the World Swimming Championships when twins Karen and Sarah Josephson won the synchronized swimming duet with a world-best score of 199.762 points in Perth, Australia. Tamas Darnyi of Hungary set a world record of 4:12.36 in the 400-meter individual medley. . . . Sports agents **Norby Walters** and **Lloyd Bloom** will be retried separately on charges that they used cash and violent threats to recruit college athletes as clients. . . . Saints coach Jim Mora and Chiefs coach Marty Schottenheimer will coach in the Jan. 19 Senior Bowl in Mobile, Ala. . . . The Meadowlands Racetrack is offering a drawing for 100 tickets tomorrow to Sunday's Giants-Bears playoff game at Giants Stadium.

FIRST RACE: Sovereign Song should benefit from local debut vs. better following freshening now drops and is suited by speed up front here. Crown Land, winless last year, disappointed on wet track in last but meets weaker and should sit good trip. Space Above raced well in both recent winter-track starts; 12 times second or third in 24 starts last year.

SECOND RACE: King Alain, outposted in last and unsuited by two turns previously, is nicely placed here, his second start with blinkers. Take It To Heart stumbled at the start of two-turn winter-track debut, losing all chance, and is suited better by sprinting. Orphan Orle finished willingly late in quickly run local debut, his first start since Oct. 7, and can better this rating.

THIRD RACE: Night Thunder has worked well for return from layup and likes the inner track; nicely placed with these. Vigorous Reply has had two starts since layoff now drops for live outfit; likely to improve. What A Misogynist set live pressured pace throughout his last, holding gamely, and was claimed by Ferriola; watch.

FOURTH RACE: Heir To Raja ran his best race ever while fresh in this class two back, has worked steadily, and switches to apprentice. Second showed improved early speed in last and drops into open claimer for the first time. Kabala and Nanjekim make their debuts vs. ordinary maidens here and either could prove the key.

FIFTH RACE: Tagore finished boldly in quickly run debut then dully in two subsequent sprint starts on this track; tries route with blinkers added. Pelican Pass placed gamely in 7-

furlong return from layup Dec. 3 and should like added distance; has met good ones. Pro Serve showed some improvement in two-turn debut following wide trip in quickly run key-race sprint prior, now gets blinkers.

SIXTH RACE: Wall St. Girl closed a gap late in well meant quickly run local debut after stumbling at the break; with normal improvement. . . . Rising Sunflower, too close to the early pace going longer last time, benefits from slight turn-back and promise of careful rating. Shenandoah is consistently quicker than these but is questionable at the route.

SEVENTH RACE: Lucky Nickie showed good early speed going long twice now turns back to favorable sprint distance. Romp was freshened briefly after being overmatched in top-figure key-race stakes; should be set for these. Shiny Copper Penny showed some improvement in blinkers in wet, winter-track debut; hot outfit.

EIGHTH RACE: Valid Case raced willingly in rough-trip Joe Palmer following brief layup; meets similar and taken to sit inside-trip behind the speed. Senor Cielo, out of his element in wet-track two-turn Pha. Park stakes, turns back to more favorable distance; quicker than these on top try. Teddy Drone has lost a step to age but could beat these on best go.

NINTH RACE: Grayson and Grohn was a good-figure winner over slightly better at this distance in last; repeats with similar try. Asian Star went well for third behind top choice in last. Skyflash, coming up to this nicely, showed some improvement in second start following layup and benefits from rider switch.
