Although agent Norby Walters was sentenced to five years in prison, he never spent a minute behind bars because he won two subsequent appeals. But that doesn't mean Walters didn't pay for his role in the illegal recruitment of college players and subsequent misdeeds. Walters had to pay more than \$1 million in legal fees and give up his representation business.

The impact of his case resulted in 23 states - but not Illinois - having agent laws with criminal penalties.

Walters lives in the Los Angeles area staging events for clients in the entertainment business.

Walters' partner in recruiting athletes, Lloyd Bloom, was also convicted of racketeering and had his conviction overturned. He was found shot to death in his Malibu, Calif., home in August, 1993.
