## Lendl Advances to Final With Win Over Carlsson

Top-seeded Ivan Lendl, looking sharp after a rain delay of more than five hours, powered into the final of the Italian Open tennis championships yesterday with a 6-3, 6-3 victory over fifth-seeded Kent Carlsson. No. 14 Guillermo Perez-Roldan of Argentina downed unseeded Ronald Agenor of Haiti, 6-3, 6-3, in the other semifinal of the \$825,000 clay-court tournament.

Lendl played his best match of the tournament after three lackluster three-set victories. He attacked Carlsson's looping topspin groundstrokes and came through with big first serves, while the Swede played exclusively from the baseline and committed more errors than usual.

Lendl said he spent the rain delay watching the Cup of England soccer match, in which Wimbledon upset English League champion Liverpool, 1-0, and NBA games on television. He said he was about to fall asleep when tournament officials told him the match was resuming shortly before 8 p.m.

Perez-Roldan's victory halted the surprising run of Agenor, who had upset second-seeded Mats Wilander and American teenager Andre Agassi. Perez-Roldan won the Munich tournament last week and has not dropped a set in Rome.

Steffi Graf beat fellow West German Claudia Kohde-Kilsch, 6-1, 6-0, to advance to the \$300,000 Berlin tournament final. Graf faces Helena Sukova, who beat Sylvia Hanika, 6-2, 6-3.

## Sluman a Shot Ahead After 3 Rounds

Jeff Sluman, a non-winner on the PGA Tour, birdied the last hole with a 20-foot putt to take a one-shot lead over faltering Ben Crenshaw and Bruce Lietzke after 54 holes of the \$750,000 Byron Nelson Golf Classic in Irving, Texas.

Sluman had a three-birdie, no-bogey 67 for a 10-under-par 200 total. Crenshaw, who had a two-shot lead when the day began, bogeyed three of the last five holes and finished with a par 70. Lietzke had a three-putt bogey on the final green for a 66 to tie Crenshaw. Paul Azinger used only 25 putts in shooting a 7-under-par 63, just a shot off the course record, to move into contention for the \$135,000 first prize at 204.

Bruce Crampton shot a 5-under-par 65 to climb from ninth place into a one-stroke lead at 4-under 136 after two rounds of the \$225,000 United Hospitals Senior Classic in Malvern, Pa. Lou Graham and Billy Casper were second, shooting 67. Quinton Gray, who led after an opening-round 67, double-bogeyed on Nos. 6 and 7 on his way to a 78 and fell back to 145.

## Lopez Leads LPGA Event by 1

Nancy Lopez shot a 2-under-par 70 to take a one-stroke lead over Alice Ritzman after two rounds of the \$250,000 Chrysler-Plymouth Classic in Middletown, N.J. Lopez had four birdies and two bogeys and was at 6-under 138 after 36 holes. Ritzman had a wild round of 71 that included five birdies, four bogeys and three par-saving putts from at least 15 feet.

## Iowa to Register Agents

Sports agents seeking to recruit Iowa athletes will have to register with the state and meet NCAA rules under legislation signed into law by Gov. Terry Branstad. The regulations, sparked by a controversy over payments by an agent to Iowa football star Ronnie Harmon, require agents to post a \$25,000 bond and forbid them to sign athletes before their eligibility expires. Agents who break the rules can be slapped with a \$10,000 civil penalty, as well as criminal prosecution.

## High Schools

Aarona Watson of Midwood ran 2:11.25 in the girls 800 meters, the fastest time in the United States this season, Kyron Agard of Tilden won the girls 400-meter hurdles in 55 seconds, the second-fastest time in the United States this season, and the Tilden boys 1,600-meter relay team set a meet record of 3:47.07 at the 21st Loucks Memorial Track and Field Games in White Plains. . . . Darryl Richardson of Martin Luther won three events and was named outstanding runner in the Atlantic Lutheran Coastal meet in Hicksville. L.I. Richardson won the 100 meters (10.7), 200 (24.2) and 400 (55.1). Martin Luther won the girls team title.

Dino Zaccagno pitched a four-hitter and drove in the only run as Stepinac (8-6) beat Mount St. Michael in baseball. . . . John O'Leary had a two-run homer to lead Spellman (7-7) past Hayes, 6-5. . . . Fieldston (12-2) scored four runs in the sixth, capped by Adam Michael's two-run single, for a 10-9 win over Horace Mann (10-6). . . . In girls basketball, Heidi Haspel of St. Peter's scored 21 to lead Elmcor to a 78-55 win over the Hudson Valley Knights in an AAU 16-and-under regional semifinal.

## Furthermore . . .

Virginia Gardner of Indianapolis set a world record when she hauled in an 813-pound blue marlin on 130-pound-test line in the Kona Gold Jackpot Tournament at Kailua-Kona, Hawaii. The record of 737½ was set in 1981. Gardner, 43, took three hours to land the fish. . . . Bradley Anderson of New York lost, 5-3, to eventual 198-pound champ Mike Houck at the Olympic Greco-Roman wrestling qualifying tournament in Boca Raton, Fla.
