Jets Speculating

They're 'selling the future' to free agents

During a stop in New York on his post-Super Bowl talk-show tour, Larry Brown - the unlikely MVP of Super Bowl XXX — was asked by a local sportscaster if he'd consider signing with the Jets. The Cowboys cornerback, a free agent, responded with a facial expression that usually comes from sucking on a lemon. The Jets? Finally, he laughed and said, in essence, "Not a chance."

Another slap at the Jets. To paraphrase Kermit the Frog, it isn't easy being green.

Nothing is easy for the Jets, especially when it comes to luring marquee free agents. After all, they're not exactly overflowing with attractive qualities. The team finished with the worst record in the NFL this past season, hasn't won a division title in 26 years, has a head coach who has lost 20 of his last 23 games, has no legitimate star players and plays on artificial turf in a stadium it can't even call its own.

How tough will it be for the Jets to compete in the free-agent market? Many sports agents, the men who wield considerable clout in the free-agent game, said the Jets face a major battle in trying to overcome the

also-ran stigma. "As an agent, it would be hard to convince one of my clients to go there," said Gary Wichard, who arranged for two clients — Rob Moore and Terance Mathis — to leave the Jets in recent years. "Most players don't want to play for losing teams. Anybody who says they're going to a 3-13 team is going because of monetary reasons, which makes you wonder: Are they driven by money or driven by success?"

The Jets, with one of the lowest payrolls in the league, have plenty to spend — they are approximately \$5 million under the \$38.8-million salary cap. Therein lies their best weapon against the financially strapped upper-echelon teams. The Jets showed their willingness to spend by signing right tackle David Williams to

a five-year, \$12.25-million contract, which included a whopping \$3-million signing bonus.

Some agents believe the Jets overpaid for Williams. Careless spending, they said, could hurt the team in the long run.

"The Jets will have to overpay on everybody," said a prominent agent who requested anonymity. "They can't compete on equal footing. But if they overpay for a guy like [Neil] O'Donnell, they will be behind the 8ball and lose their salary-cap advantage."

Look what happened last year. Desperate for defensive help, the Jets doled out \$3.5 million in signing bonuses to Tony Casillas, Erik Howard and Todd Scott, none of whom became a steady contributor. Those kind of mistakes can haunt a team for years.


What the Jets need is a watershed year to change the club's fortunes. If they can sign at least two impact free agents - O'Donnell and Lions left tackle Lomas Brown are the primary targets — and field a winning team this season, it would enhance their marketability in 1997.

"If the Jets can put together a winning program, the place would recruit itself," said former Jet Jeff Lageman, who spurned the Jets last offseason to accept virtually the same free-agent offer from the expansion Jaguars. "When you're winning, there's no place like New York. The hard part is to get to that level. They've never been able to do it."

Lageman believes much of the Jets' problem is rooted in coaching instability. Indeed, they've had three head coaches in the last three seasons, which sends a bad message to players around the league.

Despite the constant change and the perpetual losing, the Jets are optimistic they can make a big splash in free agency. "We think we've got a pretty good product to sell," personnel director Dick Haley said. "We've got New York, and our stadium is full every week. We feel we have a good organization, and we know we have a potentially strong defense."

But why would a proven winner sign with the Jets? Why would O'Donnell leave his Pittsburgh penthouse for the Jets' basement?

"You've seen guys go to teams that you never would've expected," Haley said. "Reggie White decided to go to Green Bay. The process has proven there's no exact science for what motivates a player to sign with a certain team."

Salesmanship is crucial in free-agent recruiting. If the Jets can land O'Donnell and a quality left tackle, they probably can convince Newt Gingrich to become a Democrat. The Jets can't sell their past or the present, so they have to sell the future.

"In every disaster, there's opportunity," said agent Leigh Steinberg, who represents Williams and O'Donnell. "The Jets are laying out long-term plans and offering people a chance to be part of what they hope is a dynasty. You can get in on the ground floor of a rebuilding project."

Williams bought into it.

"They're definitely headed in the right direction," said Williams, who hit it off with new offensive coordinator Ron Erhardt. "That's one of the reasons I chose here, just to be part of what's coming in the future."
